LBC EB highlights insurance crisis, evangelism growth

WOODWORTH, La. (LBM) – During the May 7 general session of the Louisiana Baptist Convention Executive Board, LBC Executive Director Steve Horn encouraged members to be passionate about sharing the Gospel.

He also provided an update about efforts to resolve the church insurance crisis plaguing congregations of all denominations across the state.

EVANGELISM MOVEMENT

Horn said that since the Aug. 1, 2023, launch of Send Network Louisiana, the evangelistic growth initiative has produced 35 church planters, with two more headed to an assessment retreat in late May and an additional 29 potential planters in the assessment pipeline. An assessment retreat center has been established

ALEXANDRIA, La. (LBM) – Several members of the Louisiana Christian University Class of 2024 encouraged their classmates to be a light for Christ during the college's 169th Commencement, May 4, inside Guinn Auditorium on campus.

SBC 2024:

Law Amendment biggest issue in '24

INDIANAPOLIS, Indiana (LBM) -- One of the biggest issues Southern Baptists will address in 2024 is a constitutional change known as the Law Amendment.

A two-thirds vote in Indianapolis would add a sixth element to Article III (which lists the qualifications for a church to send messengers to participate in the yearly business meeting) to further define that "only men" may serve "as any kind of pastor or elder" in a congregation that affiliates with the Southern Baptist Convention.

This constitutional initiative was launched in 2022 by Mike Law, who is the pastor of Arlington Baptist Church, Arlington, Virginia. He said he was moved to act after the SBC

Transparency is another hot topic

INDIANAPOLIS, Indiana (LBM) -- Another hot topic for Indianapolis will be the issue of transparency, or lack of it, from the entities of the Southern Baptist Convention.

Specifically, two motions were made during the 2023 SBC Annual Meeting requesting more detailed information from entities, including the wages of the highest paid employees of each.

One asked that entities submit the same information found in IRS FORM 990 (required of all nonprofits, except churches) to the Convention. The other moved that the SBC Business and Financial Plan be amended to mandate the printing of the same type of information in the Book of Reports.

Those who take the

time to prepare for a disaster could save their lives or at least make surviving more tolerable by making a disaster kit out of a bucket or other container.

Also, they are in a better position to assist their neighbors and others who survived the disaster.

This is important because every disaster gives the believer an opportunity to "show" the Gospel and to share the Gospel.

The disaster relief ministry of the Louisiana Baptist Convention is championing the "Disaster Ready Church" ministry. This is a comprehensive program designed to assist churches in preparing for disasters on three levels:

- -- equipping individuals and families;
- -- empowering church leaders; and
- -- enabling churches to serve their communities and beyond in times of disaster.

Please reach out to me, stan.statham@lbc.org, if you would like me or a disaster relief staff member or volunteer to speak to your church or group about preparing for disas-

But because this is such an important issue in our state, I have provided some basic information below to help you prepare now.

DISASTER KIT

First, make a kit, or, as The Disaster Ready Church ministry says, "make a bucket list.

Each family should think through what they will need. As a start, the local parish Office of Homeland Security should be able to share the most likely disasters that parish residents should prepare to

The disaster relief page, www.louisianabaptists.org/ dr, offers information on what items to include in your kit for each situation. However, as a minimum, a family should have on hand three days of food and water for each mem-

Put these and other items in a plastic container or bucket for quick retrieval in case of an emergency evacuation.

SBC 2024: President

Six individuals have been announced as intended nominees for Southern Baptist Convention president

The following Annual Church Profile information is presented to allowreaders to assess the evangelistic effectiveness of the individual's home church (per capita baptisms) as well as the congregation's financial commitment to the cooperative missions and ministries of Southern Baptists (Cooperative Program percentage of undesignated receipts). Finally, some personal information is provided about the

For comparison, the average baptism to worship attendance ratio for the entire SBC is 1:18 (226,919 baptisms, 4,050,668 average worship attendance, 2024ACP). Also, the Convention average CP percentage is 4.59 percent (\$457,417,314 total Cooperative Program gifts for state and national causes, \$9,962,910,482 combined undesignated receipts for all congregations, 2023 SBC Annual).

SBC Bylavs, Article X "Election of Officers and Voting" provides a process for runoff elections: "If an officer does not receive a majority of votes cast on the first ballot, subsequent ballots shall carry the names of those who are included in the top 50 percent of the total votes cast in the previous ballot."

Credentials Committee delayed a decision about disfellowshipping Saddleback Church in Lake Forest, California, for having ordained three female staff members as pastors in 2021.

The Baptist Faith & Message 2000 states, "While both men and women are gifted for service in the church, the office of pastor/ elder/overseer is limited to men as qualified by Scripture." However, the committee said it could not act in 2022 "until clarity is provided regarding the use of the title 'pastor' for staff positions with different responsibility and authority than that of the lead pastor."

Law said he offered his motion to amend the Constitution to provide that clarity.

Despite a negative recommendation from the SBC Executive Committee during the 2023 SBC Annual Meeting, media reports indicated 80 percent of messengers raised ballots in favor of the Law Amendment. However, any constitutional change needs at least two-thirds approval during two consecutive annual meetings for that item to be enacted.

cording to *The Baptist Paper*, the issue behind the motions is "trust" based on accountability.

One of the motion makers, Rhett Burns, pastor of First Baptist Church Travelers Rest, South Carolina, told the newspaper in February 2024 that such trust is lacking, in part, because SBC entities do not meet the minimum standard of every other nonprofit.

"We fail to clear the lowest bar. Instead of leading, we lag worldly institutions, operating in financial obscurity where Jesus tells us to walk in the light," he said.

Some entity leaders pushed back, opposing the push for more transparency because of supposed additional costs as well as unintended consequences such as the potential of the IRS to require entities to release donor information, according to *The Baptist Paper*.

They also claim sufficient information is provided in entity audits which are published in the SBC Annual.

However, the audits printed in the SBC Annual lack specificity, Burns said


IRS Form 990 requires all nonprofits and charities, except churches, to list all "current officers, directors, and trustees" as well as "up to 20 current employees who satisfy the definition of key employee (persons with certain responsibilities and reportable compensation greater than \$150,000 from the organization and related organizations), and its five current highest compensated employees with reportable compensation of at least \$100,000 from the organization

The SBC Business and Financial Plan does mandate that members of cooperating Southern Baptist churches "have access to information from the records of Southern Baptist Convention entities regarding income, expenditures, debts, reserves, operating balances, and


salary structures" (a salary structure list paygrades for job levels and pay ranges within those paygrades but does not give actual salary information for an employee). However, during the 2021 SBC Annual Meeting, the North American Mission Board declared it would only allow certain Southern Baptists to view this general information on a "case by case basis."

This instance, in front of the Convention, of seemingly refusing to comply with Article XIV "Safeguarding of Funds" of the SBC Business and Financial appears to have prompted the messenger calls for transparency during the annual meetings that have followed.

According to the IRS, the "Return of Organization Exempt from Income Tax," or Form 990, was implemented in 1941 to provide "the public with information about a nonprofit organization" and to "prevent organizations from abusing their taxexempt status."

No more than the pastor and two members from any church may serve on all boards and committees, combined, at any one time. Likewise, no more than one member of the same church may serve on the same board or committee at any one time.

RESOLUTIONS

The first Committee on Resolutions meeting is scheduled for Sept. 17 and submissions are requested to be sent as early as possible for consideration. Resolutions may be submitted for review and consideration no more than 90 days and no fewer than 15 days prior to the LBC annual meeting, Nov. 14, providing a window of opportunity from Aug. 14 through Oct. 28.

All statements should be typewritten, titled, and


dated, and accompanied by a letter – from a church qualified to send a messenger to the annual meeting of the Louisiana Baptist Convention – certifying that the person submitting the resolution is a member in good standing. The letter should include complete contact information for both the person submitting it and his or her church.

No person may submit more than three resolutions per year.

"I really believe we can see a movement take place in our state as people come to know Jesus and more disciples are made and churches are planted across the state," Crawford told Baptist Message. "Our heart is Louisiana. We want to see Louisiana come to Christ.

"Louisiana Baptists have continually blessed my familv and the churches that we planted over the years. We have experienced first-hand the amazing work of God that results from the prayer, partnership, and participation of Louisiana Baptists. This is a wonderful opportunity to serve Louisiana Baptists and seek to have a Kingdom impact in the

A veteran church planter for 18 years, Crawford started Life Point Community Church, Mansura (2006-2020). During that time, he saw the church grow from 10 to over 250 and baptize

Through the years, he served in a variety of other ministerial roles: youth pastor with Holloway Baptist Church, Deville (2002-2004); interim pastor of multiple churches in central Louisiana (2004-2006); director of missions with Louisiana Baptist Association (2017-2020); and director with City Life NOLA and pastor with City Life Church, New Orleans (2020-present). He will continue to serve with City Life NOLA and City Life Church on a more limited basis.

A native of Deville,

Crawford holds bachelor's and master's degrees from Louisiana College (now Louisiana Christian University); a master's degree from Liberty Baptist Theological Seminary, Lynchburg, Va.; and a doctorate in educational ministry from New Orleans Baptist Theological Seminary.

Crawford and his wife, Allyson, have two children, Alyvia and Avynleigh.

James Jenkins, director of the Louisiana Baptist missions and ministry team, said Crawford has "hit the ground running" since he assumed his new role May 1.

"Jacob is almost a perfect fit with his experience with the Louisiana Baptist Convention as a pastor, associational missionary and church planter. He has a network of relationships all over Louisiana and I'm looking forward to him coming in very quickly to begin to help with the process of planting more churches and reaching more people in the state for Christ.'

SEND NETWORK LOUISIANA PARTNERSHIP

Crawford said he is looking forward to help furthering the Send Network Louisiana, a partnership between the North

American Mission Board of the Southern Baptist Convention and the Louisiana Baptist Convention.

The partnership, which went into effect Aug. 1, 2023, has a goal to expand God's Kingdom in Louisiana by one percent (about 28,000) in a decade. Researchers estimate that 60 percent of 4,648,794 Louisianans are lost (about 2,789,276). If successful, 28,875 Louisianans will be added to the Kingdom through 231 new churches planted in the state by 2033 (based on each reaching 125 people with the Gospel). These salvations will be in addition to those recorded by already established Louisiana Baptist congregations.

This partnership includes four years of monthly supplements for Send Network church plants; five years of Send Network Planter Care (the North American Mission Board church planter spiritual and emotional care system); access to NAMB start-up grants and a year of free health insurance; and a \$1,000 retirement benefit through GuideStone for planters and their families.

"Please pray that God would raise up an army of disciple makers and that Louisiana would be trans-

annually, with the goal of producing 12 candidates per retreat.

The Louisiana Baptist partnership with the North American Mission Board has a God-sized vision to see His Kingdom expanded in Louisiana by one percent (about 28,000) over the next decade. Researchers estimate that 60 percent of 4,648,794 Louisianans are lost (about 2,789,276). If successful, 28,875 Louisianans will be added to the Kingdom through 231 new churches planted in the state by 2033 (based on each reaching 125 people with the Gospel). These salvations will be in addition to those recorded by already established Louisiana Baptist congregations.

The goal of reaching 28,875 new people can be obtained with a combination of planting 231 new churches reaching 125 people with the Gospel. These salvations will be accomplished in a cooperative effort with already established Louisiana Baptist congregations.

Since the partnership began, Send Network Louisiana church plants have reported, collectively: 2,854 in weekly worship; 1,954 Gospel conversations; 183 salvation decisions; 79 baptisms; 1,506 discipled; and \$21,350 given to the Cooperative Program.

Beyond the Send Network Louisiana church plants, Horn shared that other evangelism milestones have included 8,375 baptisms by Louisiana Baptist churches in 2023, an increase of 1,685 from 2022.

"And I believe that we can realistically see that soon, maybe even this year if the Lord wills, that we can get to 10,000 baptisms per year," he said. "Let's do it."

Sharing Acts 17, Horn said there are at least six inescapable truths about people to whom the Apostle Paul addressed in that passage: they are religious; God appointed them to be among us in both time and space; God desires a relationship with them; they face judgement; each person will make a decision about Jesus; and in the end, this is deeply personal.

"As believers in Christ, the passing of our faith, the Gospel, from one generation to another is among the highest callings in life," Horn said. "However, we do not have an infinite window to exchange the baton. Because passing our faith is of the highest callings, it must have the highest priority in our lives."

CHURCH INSURANCE UPDATE

Horn said that since an advisory committee was formed, in late 2023, to help identify strategies and resources to secure onetime funding to launch the state legislature approved self-insurance program, 350 churches of various denominations have submitted the necessary historical insurance information. However, at least 650 more churches are needed to submit requested insurance policies and histories.

"This is not an immediate fix," Horn said. "This is a long-term solution. This hurricane season, and maybe even the next, is going to come and go without any additional resolution in this matter. This can be a matter of concern and should be a matter of prayer. But this cannot mean that we give up on future solutions."

Horn and Will Hall, Louisiana Baptist Office of Public Policy director, have met with legislators and other public officials and been assured of help in their attempts to secure some of the \$8-9 million in funds that will be needed to start the program. He said several bills are awaiting Gov. Jeff Landry's signature that Insurance Commissioner Tim Temple and others believe will bring some relief by bringing other insurance companies to the

Horn told board members they will continue to pray and work on Louisiana Baptists' behalf and asked pastors of all denominations to submit the basic insurance information (a current policy and a five-year record of claims, known as a "loss run report") needed to complete the modeling that has to be done to move forward.

LBF reports 16-year high short-term fund rate

ALEXANDRIA, La.

(LBM) – The Louisiana Baptist Foundation has reached its highest short-term fund rate in

more than 16 years. According to LBF **Executive Director**

Jeff Steed, the annual-

ized rate of 4.00 percent is being earned by churches and

other ministry accounts all over the state. Like a savings account, the short-term fund allows churches to invest their money with no minimum balance or investment period, lim-

itless and penalty-free withdrawals, deposits and accounts, and dailyearned interest that helps steward funds for Kingdom impact.

Steed added that the fund often offers higher interest rates than those provided through a traditional bank while providing access and availability each business day by phone, email, fax, mail or in-person visit to the foundation office inside the Louisiana Baptist Building in Alexandria.

'In the last 12 months, over \$4 million was generated for shortterm fund accounts

for churches and other ministries," Steed told


the *Baptist* Message. "We are very grateful that God is continuing to bless the Foundation's ministry through maximizing impact for those whom we have the honor to serve.

The short-term fund is one of many ways the foundation partners with Louisiana Baptist churches to build the Kingdom "one dollar at a time, one ministry at a time, one life at a time.'

More than \$43 million has been achieved toward the foundation's Vision 200 (impacting the Kingdom with \$200 million generated in 20 years or less).

The foundation also offers other money management services for churches, gift planning for individuals, estate stewardship for

guests, who received the messages from these graduates about their LCU journeys.

Saturday was the living testimony of what we do at Louisiana Christian University," Acting President David Jeffreys told the Baptist Message. "Our graduates have been equipped and prepared to fulfill the Great Commission as they go and serve Him in all walks of life. Our students shared some incredible testimonies of how God has used the LCU family to impact their lives. They will be missed but will now forever be Wildcats."

Also, remember, that a hurricane allows time for gathering supplies days ahead of landfall, but a sudden catastrophe such as a train derailment that leaks poisonous gas does not.

DISASTER PLAN

Take time as a family to plan what to do in emergencies before you face a crisis. When the situation is deteriorating is not the time to decide.

Identify when and where to evacuate in case of such events as a house fire. Be sure it is a location familiar to all family members.

Write out and memorize how you will communicate with each other inside and outside the disaster zone.

If you have extended family living in different areas, designate a contact

person for each member to check in with as soon as possible after a disaster strikes.

DISASTER AWARENESS

Keep your phone's emergency alerts turned on

Make sure you have a battery-powered radio handy in case of power failure.

Finally, when you receive a severe weather warning or watch, take it seriously.

TRUST GOD, AND PLAN

Those who prepare are in a better place to survive a disaster and help others -- you could save someone's life or even your own.

Psalm 57:1 is a great reminder: "Have mercy on me, my God, have mercy on me, for in you I take refuge. I will take refuge in the shadow of your wings until the disaster has passed."

I believe, even in the storm, we can have peace because we are prepared and trust in the Lord!




